

CPSY 1970/1980: Project Proposal Form

If you are interested in enrolling in either CPSY 1970 (Directed Reading) or CPSY 1980 (Directed Research) for concentration credit in Cognitive Science, Cognitive Neuroscience, or Psychology, and your proposed sponsor does not have a primary or secondary appointment in the CPSY department, you must fill out this form for permission to enroll and to obtain credit. Return the completed form to your concentration advisor before the deadline for class registration.

All Directed Reading and Directed Research Projects must be pertinent and related to your concentration. Your concentration advisor and the Director of Undergraduate Studies (DUS) will review your proposal to ensure that it meets these criteria. If the proposal is approved, then the DUS will arrange for your sponsor to receive a course section number for CPSY 1970 or 1980.

Students pursuing Directed Reading (CPSY 1970) are expected to master and synthesize a body of literature, going beyond material covered in regular courses in both depth and critical evaluation. Students pursuing Directed Research (CPSY 1980) are expected to plan, design, and execute a research project. They are expected to develop a strong understanding of the relevant literature and to contribute meaningfully to data collection and analysis. All projects must have a clear intellectual relationship to the student's concentration in CPSY. Keep in mind that CPSY 1970 and 1980 require 180 hours of time commitment over the course of the semester.

Only Brown faculty members with primary or secondary appointments in CPSY may sponsor independent study courses for CPSY concentration credit. Faculty members must be at a Professional rank (Professor, Teaching Professor, Research Professor, or Professor of the Practice) at any level (assistant, associate, full). Clinical Professors, instructors, post-doctoral research associates, and adjunct faculty are not eligible to act as sponsors. Faculty at other institutions are not permitted to sponsor independent studies.

Faculty sponsors are responsible for supervising the student to ensure that the student logs 180 hours of instructional time per semester. Regular meetings with the student are essential to discuss progress, with at least one face-to-face meeting per semester. Faculty sponsors should set specific benchmarks for progress, including grading criteria and deadlines for submission of written work. Faculty sponsors are responsible for obtaining funding for the project, for ensuring the project has received IRB or IACUC approval, for ensuring that the student has received necessary training (e.g., CITI, Laboratory Safety), and for ensuring students have access to research participants. IRB approval, IACUC approval, and training requirements must be complete before data collection begins.

What resources (including funding, materials, access to research participants) are available in your research group to support the student's project? The CPSY department does not provide funds to support CPSY 1970 and 1980 projects.
